Discover the hamlet of *Transgardon*, nestled in the mountains of the South of France in the Cevennes National Park between Languedoc-Roussillon and Auvergne



Transgardon, sheltered in a pleasant cirque, hosts two streamlets (Gardons) which flow together and fertilize the soil of Transgardon.



Several families used to dwell in the ancient stone houses of the hamlet, where they lived off the land. However, the extinction of an entire generation of the peasantry meant that Nature once again seized possession of the country side.



Some of these old houses, called *Mas Cevenol*, survived the rape of time and then one day were rediscovered by the two of us. As true friends of Nature, we were completely mesmerized by the startlingly beautiful site and knew we had found our very own Paradise.

However, before we could share this treasure with you, we needed several months to bring it up to standard.

As of 15th August 2011 Transgardon has been eagerly awaiting your visit.

## What can you do in Transgardon?

Well, you can go for a swim, stroll along the banks of the rivulet, discover the charm of the woods, its flowers and animals. Or enjoy the supreme luxury of doing nothing at all.

### Guest-rooms in Cévennes - Rooms full of charm in Transgardon

Our guest-rooms are situated in a separate house looking down on the streamlet with a natural pool under the centuries-old picturesque bridge.

In this stone house, typical for the region, we have our 3 guest-rooms on 3 floors, each with its own separate entrance.

It took much loving care to convert a typical croft house into our 3 guest-rooms "La Chambre Haute", "La Chambre Guetali" and "La Chambre Voûtée", using traditional materials, thereby combining the charm of days long gone age with the comforts of our modern age.

Outdoors you can also enjoy a quiet rest in the garden in the shade of trees or old walls..

Or if you prefer it less comfortable you can perhaps choose a moss-covered rock on the banks of the rivulet or an old tree-trunk to indulge in your life of doing sweet nothing.

If you can resist the temptation of walking down to the streamlet, the sound of its flowing will still rock you to sleep at night.



#### Your breakfast

Whether you are up with the lark or you take advantage of a long lie-in, your breakfast will prove a real treat: plentiful and especially prepared according to a sacred rite established by Frédérique for you.

## "La Chambre Haute"



To guarantee a comfortable sojourn the "Chambre Haute" possesses

- furnishings of much character
- a large comfortable bed (160  $\times$  200 cm) which can also be easily transformed into two twin beds. As a supplement, we have added a mezzanine bed for one adult or two children, equipped with futons and tatami mats.
- a small sitting room
- a meticulously designed bathroom with all facilities (spacious shower, hair-dryer....)

For your wellbeing and that of our planet the reconstruction of the "Chambre Haute" was carried out in the main with biological materials: plaster made of a mixture of lime and hemp; the roof was insulated with hemp; biological paint and glazes free of any toxic emanation were used. The materials and techniques employed are based on the traditional know-how of the Cévennes for the comfort of our guests.

### Our Guest-room in Cévennes nowadays, our living space as it was and in days of yore...

When you see the "Chambre Haute" today you will require no end of imagination to know how it looked originally. This is not only due to the renovations we have made: the age of the building (several centuries old) and the multiple purposes for which it was used during the ages must likewise be considered. Originally it must have been used as living quarters as traces of an old fireplace were discovered; furthermore, it served as a storage shed for agricultural appliances and finally it was used to store chestnuts.

When first we turned the enormous key in the old rusty lock the door squeaked on opening and we were confronted by what looked like something from a museum: a pile of old furniture, all sorts of utensils, old worm-eaten chests (without any treasure), planks, tools and other testimonies of a past that can no longer be restored... and all of this carefully enveloped in spider's webs of every conceivable design and age.

How on earth could we renovate this without destroying the spirit of the room? Little by little the idea grew in our heads that it would be essential to preserve the volume and visible framework, keep the original size of the doors and windows and use the corners in the walls for decorative purposes. And that was that.

- a travertine-tiled bathroom with all facilities (spacious shower, hair-dryer....)
- cork flooring

At the front door a small elevated terrace looks out onto the meadow and the old bridge of Transgardon.

#### Our guest-room of today was where our ancestors once lived.

Without doubt the "Chambre Guetali" was formerly used as a living-room as is clearly indicated by the baking oven and the huge fireplace and chimney beam.

On the ceiling the chestnut beams, blackened by decades of smoke, have now acquired the hue of golden bread thanks to tireless scrubbing with steel wool and a steel brush. Part of the floor, partially tiled, rests on the vault of the room below which is now the "Chambre Voûtée".

A word on the side: some time we were unable to enter this room! Why ever not? Simply because we had no key... mislaid by the former owners. So we could not explore the room until the day our friend Marian came to our assistance and we cut a hole in the ceiling from below. Thus we finally encountered the traces of our ancestors covered in layers of dust and spider's webs.



## Authenticity...

With its beautiful stone vaulting masoned long, long ago, the "Chambre Voûtée" is a testimony to the artistic skill of days gone by and for this reason we simply had to keep its original character.

The bathroom offers you every modern convenience paired with the simplicity of earlier ages. The only concession is the coloured tiles on the wall which offer a playful contrast.

### Today's quest-room in Cévennes was once a wine cave or a water-mill...

You will no doubt have already guessed: the "Chambre Voûtée" had all the attributes to shelter and keep the wine barrels cool. We even found vestiges of the last harvest of some 30 years ago.

And that's not all! Would you have imagined that this ancient building once served as a water-mill? This was confirmed to us by some old-timers in the region. The drainage guttering along the top and down the side of the building substantiates this.

Price: € 28 per person


You will always have the choice between having dinner in our dining room or on the terrace with a view of the Transgardon valley in either case.

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Transgardon is located in the Southern part of the Cevennes, between two cities called Alès and Florac.

Motorway access: A7 towards South, exit "Nîmes Ouest"

#### **Driving directions**

Coming from Florac on the N106 road (30 km): 2 km after Saint-Privat de Vallongue intersection, you will find a parking lot on your right.

Coming from Alès on the N106 road (40 km): 3 km after Saint-Hilaire de Lavit intersection, you will find a parking lot on your left.

( $\underline{\textbf{Stay}}$  on the N106 road,  $\underline{\textbf{do not}}$  take the roads to the small towns of  $\underline{\textbf{Saint-Privat}}$  and  $\underline{\textbf{Saint-Hilaire}}$ . They are mentioned just as markers)



When you see the sign *Transgardon* on the top of a mailbox, it means that you have found the parking lot!

20 meters below is the bend , where a track dug into schist rocks begins. This track leads to the hamlet (1 km long).

In any case, we strongly advise you first to stop at the parking lot, get out of the car and look for the entrance to the track before driving in. It is completely suitable and safe for motor vehicles even if it might seem a bit intimidating if it is your first visit to the Cevennes.

#### Transgardon GPS coordinates (according to géoportail)

- Start of the trip on the N106 road: Longitude 03°51′11″ Latitude 44° 16′17″
- The hamlet: Longitude 03°51'26" Latitude 44°16'05"

Recently, some GPS have even been able to localize Transgardon! (Add 48240 zip code)
